#### **Mission Statement**

Through fees and fundraising, members and volunteers of the Society will maintain the building and its grounds and keep user fees and rentals at a minimum cost to the community users.

<u>Absenteeism</u>: Voting privileges will be revoked if a member misses 3 consecutive meetings or 5 regular meetings/season without notified just cause.

## 2. Voting Ahead or by Proxy

- a) If we have a quorum, we cannot vote ahead or by proxy.
- **b)** In some instances, it is acceptable to vote by email rather than calling emergency meetings.
- **3. Signing Authority (2 of 4 signatures**): Harley Newman, Melissa Bergen Graham Murray, Roger Green.

## 4. Employees

- a. Caretakers:
  - i. Ice Maintenance and Outside Janitorial Duties Leigh Simons
  - ii. Inside Janitorial Duties paid on contract
  - iii. Caretakers will be responsible to find/pay/train replacement staff should they be unavailable for work.
  - iv. The treasurer will only do payroll for a few employees.
  - v. Employees will submit hours to the Treasurer to be paid at month end.

## 5. Registration

Players will register through Spordle and fees to be paid by e-transfer to <a href="mailto:hillmondarenatreasurer@gmail.com">hillmondarenatreasurer@gmail.com</a> or by cheque/cash to the arena treasurer on or before the set due date, a late fee of \$100/player will be applied.

#### 6. Arena Fees

- a. Payment due in full by registration night, of each year. After this there will be a \$100.00 late fee applied.
- b. All arena user and rental fees must be paid prior to using the facility. Ice Scheduler will invoice all users.
- c. Members who bounce 1 cheque lose their cheque cashing privileges for that season and be charged a **\$50 NSF fee**.
- d. If for some reason, the Minor Hockey or Skating Club Programs are not working out for you, you have the option to get a refund. You have up until November 15 to write a formal letter explaining your reasons to withdraw from the program. If this is done, then you will receive a full refund of your arena fees. Absolutely no refunds after November 15th.
- e. Arena fees are charged on an annual basis, regardless of when a user is registered throughout the season. No prorated discount for late registrants. Deadline for registrations will coincide with SHA deadline to register final rosters.

#### 7. Rentals

- a) Ice Scheduler will communicate with renters & Treasurer to ensure payment has been received.
- b) Ice Scheduler will communicate with the President or Caretakers to ensure doors are unlocked, and in some circumstances, that the rental agreement/walk through has been completed.

• **Public Skating** – Helmets must be worn. Ages 14 & under must be accompanied by their parent in the building.

#### Board Members

- a) Members are allowed 3 hours free ice rental time per year.
- **b)** Board member is responsible for opening, locking, & cleaning. If a flood is required, the board member must contact the caretaker.
- c) Members have been divided into tiers to provide yearly benefits for their volunteer time. The benefits will become effective after the position has been served for 1 year and that person continues in that position.
  - **Tier 1** Treasurer.
  - **Tier 2** Communications/Ice Scheduler, Concession Buyer, Registrar (minor hockey) and Minor Hockey President.
    - Tier 3 Arena Board President, Vice President, Secretary and Maintenance.

**Tier 1 extras** - 1 arena fee waived of \$500 and no assigned kitchen shifts throughout the season.

Tier 2 extras - 1 arena fee waived of \$500.

**Tier 3 extras** - discount of \$100 from arena fees.

## 8. Ice Scheduling

- a) Booked on a 1<sup>st</sup> Come 1<sup>st</sup> Serve basis.
- **b)** All User groups must communicate effectively with one another and the Ice Scheduler when trading or borrowing each other's ice.
- c) HMHA, Hitmen & HSC take precedence over 'participation' teams.
- **d)** The Ice Scheduler may communicate and take ice away from the other user groups for necessary events (playoffs, provincials, etc.). Ice Scheduler will negotiate alternate dates and times if available.

#### 9. Concession

- a) Whenever possible HMHA teams and HSC should open the concession during practices.
- b) The Concession Communication Book will list all rules and regulations.
- c) HMHA teams will open the concession during games. Kitchen workers to be assigned and scheduled as communicated by Arena Scheduler. Scheduling will rotate through the entire registered player list to assign shifts.

## 10. Hiring Workers

- a) Parents can hire workers for the kitchen. Negotiate payment on their own.
   Workers must be 14 years of age.
- b) When hiring a shift this must be communicated on the app chat, and attention must be taken to not have more than 2 workers during a shift that are teenagers.
- c) Workers may be hired by Parents to cover Commitment Shifts. The Arena Board will provide a list of Workers for Hire each season. Wages to be negotiated between the hiring parent and the person hired.

#### 11. Required Volunteer Kitchen Shifts

- a) HMHA & HSC members are required to fulfill their assigned kitchen shifts each season.
- b) If you are unable to fulfill your assigned kitchen shifts, it is the members responsibility to hire the shift out.
